Stewardship

Our stewardship season is underway, and so far we've received **86** pledge forms back with \$258,557 pledged to Operating and \$84,574 to Missions. Our goal is to have 130 families pledging. To meet the needs of the proposed 2025 budget, we are hoping to have \$398,160 pledged to the Operating side. The Missions team forms their budget *after* the Missions pledges come in. Last year they worked with a budget of about \$107,000.
