We all know of the devastation left by Hurricane Helene, especially in western North Carolina. The rebuild of that area will take years! We all wonder what we can do to help in addition to providing funds. The mission team is coordinating an inter-generational work trip to Fairview, NC which is just 11 miles from Asheville the week of April 14. Seabees Outreach Ministry, a ministry of Navy veterans, is establishing a work camp there to help locals devastated by the hurricane. Stewardship

Our stewardship season is underway, and so far we've received **103** pledge forms back with **\$308,217** pledged to Operating and **\$100,114** to Missions. Our goal is to have 130 families pledging. To meet the needs of the proposed 2025 budget, we are hoping to have **\$398,160** pledged to the Operating side. The Missions team forms their budget *after* the Missions pledges come in. Last year they worked with a budget of about \$107,000.


Prayer Prompts

Chrismons

The Christmas tree is not only beautifully decorated but each ornament has significance and points to Christ. The tree is decorated in Gold and White. The white is symbolic of Christ's purity and perfection, and the gold, his majesty, glory and triumph.



The white ornaments were made with love and care in 1996 by Esther and Claude Pullis and Vera and Bob Fraser in Esther's basement.

Esther said that the men drew the shapes on Styrofoam and used a jigsaw to cut them out. She and Vera decorated them with sequins. When you look closely, you will see the intricate and delicate workmanship within each. They are called Chrismons and each points to scripture or an aspect of Jesus Christ. Chrismon is formed from the words "Christ" and "monogram" and means a representation or symbol of Christ. We are blessed that these ornaments have been so carefully preserved over the years.

A booklet describing each Chrismon, also researched and compiled by Esther, is reprinted and available for you to pick up by the sanctuary doors.
