Revisioning our Church Entry and Fellowship Spaces

~Creating spaces that will facilitate opportunities to make connections with our church family while enhancing the engagement of those new to our church~

Our Church Teams, Boards and Leadership have been working diligently to create fellowship spaces that are welcoming and embrace our traditions, that also encompass the needs of all while utilizing the spaces in the most efficient way. We are excited to announce that throughout the course of the next few months you will notice a transformation occurring to the entry of our church and Fellowship areas!

Welcome Center

We are creating an inviting Welcome Center for all to enjoy fellowship before and after our services, located in the Gathering Area.

What to Expect:

The folding tables and coat racks will be relocated, allowing for improved traffic flow and opportunities to greet and connect with others. The Welcome Center will complement our Gothic Revival Sanctuary by bringing in elements, color and character that is experienced in the Sanctuary, while still being a functioning fun gathering space. You will see wall art and new paint colors on the walls that are in step with the colors of our Sanctuary and are traditional, yet upbeat and fresh. We will enjoy seating and tables for all ages and sizes that are easily cleanable, durable and moveable. We will have improved space for coffee, water, juice and occasional snacks. We will have space to continue to display Back To School and Giving Tree tags for Christmas.

Lastly, as you have noticed, we have a 65" monitor to advise members of the current events and happenings within our church.

Fellowship Room

Updates to this area will focus on providing a comfortable lounge space for Circles and Small Groups including Sunday School classes. There is also special attention given to creating a consistent and inviting space for grieving families for funerals, as well as celebrating families for weddings.

What to expect:

You will be able to enjoy meaningful and scriptural artwork that will be enhanced by fresh paint that coordinates with our furnishings and rug. There will be new cleanable, durable and moveable seating. This space will also feature a new credenza for coffee and snacks, as well as plenty of storage for class materials that are in progress. Lastly, our old, broken folding door will be replaced with a new folding door to separate the two rooms when needed.

Conference Room / Library

This space will contain a conference table and chairs with seating for 20 and it will continue to connect to the Fellowship room to offer a cohesive space when needed. There will be a Library wall that will incorporate our memorial plaque from the existing library.

Mission Outreach Center

This space will be located in what was previously known as Mark's Slomski's office, with the goal to offer ample space to display and store our Card Ministry, Food items for various ministries and to host our approved sales throughout the year. The Outreach Mission Center will have a wide entry, so no one can miss it!

Our Pastors will continue to work from a shared space within the Pastors Office.

Coat Closet

Our coat closet will be installed along a portion of the education wing, located across from the Mission Outreach Center.

Of Special Note:

All existing artwork that has a plaque, dedication or special sentiment will have a home and will be thoughtfully and intentionally placed. We will also have a pictorial history of The United Church that will be developed over time on the education wing walls and the Gibson Street side entry, within our current library space.

We are very blessed to have the resources and talent required to create and enhance these spaces within our church. Thank you for your patience and support with the process. These well thought out goals and plans take time and we will not see the completed vision for several months.
