



It was a great opportunity to join with over fifty others in "hands on" mission work right here in Canandaigua to support the worthy work of Greater Rochester Habitat for Humanity in bringing hope to a family through home ownership. The walls



framed last week in the parking lot of Zion Fellowship will be used in the construction of the new home going up on Tillotson Street in the near future. Our United Church contributed financially toward the \$10,000 needed for lumber and supplies with a donation of \$7,000 from the generous gift of the Boyce family. Funds were taken from the "Mission and Spiritual Development Support" allocation area and reflect well one of their intended uses... "local service partnerships involving hands-on service."
