Easter Season



Easter Sunday is a high Sunday for Christians. We celebrate the central tenet of our faith: Jesus is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed!

Did you know that Easter is not just one Sunday but a season in the church calendar? It begins on Resurrection Sunday and continues to Pentecost Sunday. We will follow the church calendar through the Easter Season this year, utilizing the weekly Lectionary readings.

The readings often include Jesus' post-resurrection appearances. So, we will discuss two of these appearances on the first two Sundays in April. We will then transition to the epistle readings for the final four weeks in the season of Easter, which are from John's first epistle.

John's epistles offer fundamental teachings of the Christian faith. John pens these letters as an older man. He had walked with Jesus in his earlier years and has seen the church develop over the first century. As he writes, he is pastoring churches in and around Ephesus. These churches are encountering false teachers who are seeking to distort the gospel. John's letters are sermons to correct the rampant misconceptions in the first century.

I look forward to studying these passages with you in April and May.

"He has risen" Mark 16:6 "Go and tell" Mark 16:6 and Mark 16:15

The United Church has recently examined Jesus' life, teachings, and his directives to his followers as recorded in Mark's Gospel. Jesus taught grounded in Scripture. Jesus, acting according to Scripture, revealed God's compassionate love to multiple subcultures.

Going and telling by actions and words. Jesus did many acts of mercy and also called his people into a deeper relationship with God. 2000 years – approximately 2000 years since Jesus told his disciples to "go and tell" we followers of Christ continue communicating with actions and words.

Ryan and Alethia White, commissioned missionaries, have been pastors to Syrian Christian refugees in Berlin. They also actively connect with the western European Christian leader's network bringing hope, love, and Christ to a broken world. (Our other named missionaries have also learned multiple languages and live in differing cultures.)

Thank you, United Church, for the March One Great Hour of Sharing gifts (total unknown at time of printing). CCIA is able to distribute the **45 birthday bags** created by Wednesday's Youth Club. Diapers (544!) and baby wipes (23 packages) were delivered to CareNet. Your generous contribution each week to our **food cart** is important to CCIA and the Salvation Army food pantries.

Connections in Haiti: Medical Benevolent Foundation, an organization we have supported for many years, partners with Haitian hospital St. Croix, in Leogane. Forty miles west of the capitol the hospital's nursing school and medical staff was continuing to "heal the sick and wounded" March 12. Prayers that they can continue. Prayers for healing in all of Haiti.

May 21, 2024: **Save the date**. Ryan and or Alethia White will be United Church guests. Currently in the USA their elementary aged daughters are having their first experiences in US schools. 

Nicaragua Mission Trip ~ February 2024

Our mission group which started back in 2014, sponsored by American Baptist International Ministries, had another success mission trip to La Pimienta, Nicaragua. Our group was able to install solar panels on their medic clinic, install lighting with switches, do water testing in a number of sites, install new doors for security and have VBS sessions with children.



VBS was especially rewarding to see the enthusiasm and fun they had. We held lessons on the Creation and on Haman's cure for leprosy, lessons of God and water. Each lesson was accompanied with pictures for coloring. Much



of the VBS material that we used was supplied by Deb Marshall and Ken Allen. Treats and juice were especially enjoyed! Each session concluded with the children enjoying outdoor play.

CHILDREN'S AND FAMILY MINISTRY

Personal reflection...

The month of April begins with spring break for schools. I'm grateful for this break because March was a very busy month for our family and for ministry work. School breaks don't mean I'm "off," but they do mark a different pace for a week, which is usually welcome. I also think this break will be important because we have busy months ahead as we prepare to "launch" Emma and as I continue ministry work.

As many of you know, Ryan and I are entering a new season of parenting. Emma is graduating this year and will be headed off to college. It is quite possible that by the end of April, we will know what college she is planning to attend. While this is a very exciting time, it is also a scary time as a parent...especially when it's your first or oldest child headed off.

However, we are repeatedly told in Scripture, "do not be afraid." In fact, I have heard that the phrases such as "don't be afraid" and "fear not" appear 365 times in the Bible. I'm not a Bible scholar, and I don't know if that's really true, but I do know that God doesn't want us to live in fear.

Pastor Wade gave a sermon on March 10th about Jesus' power over death, based on Mark 5:21-43. If you missed it, I urge you to watch the livestream or listen to the podcast. During the sermon, Wade pointed out that when Jesus overheard people from Jairus' house come and tell him that his daughter had died and that he shouldn't bother Jesus any longer, Jesus had a different response. He said to Jairus, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

There are a lot of big decisions looming for Emma. When she was a child, we could guide, direct, or orchestrate almost every decision she made. We have, of course, let Emma make more and more decisions as she's grown up. However, fully letting your child go and make decisions completely on their own is a scary place to be as a parent. But I hear God saying, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

If I focus on the world and look at the lies being told to my children and the children of our church family, I can feel overwhelmed. I know the Truth, and can teach them the Truth to the best of my ability. We are blessed to have an army of volunteers who help teach kids the Truth on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings. But, what if it's not enough? Again, I hear God saying, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

My parents and Ryan's parents are healthy right now and doing well, but what if one of them becomes ill and needs care? What if there is something one of them is ignoring and they need treatment? What if...? Yet I hear God saying, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

The world we live in often seems full of hate and evil. People hold their opinions so sacred that they will not even listen to the other side, much less have a conversation. There's war happening in too many countries, gang violence taking innocent lives, and the list goes on. How easy it can be to hear and see all of this and wonder, 'where are you, God?' But I hear Him saying, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

God doesn't want us to live in fear. He wants us to trust Him. He is always faithful, always loves us, and is always at work. If this resonates with you and you have the chance, look up the song, Firm Foundation by Maverick City Music. Below are some of the lyrics to the song, which I love because they tell the story of our faithful God. No matter what life brings, remember, "Don't be afraid, just believe."

After this human sexuality conversation, we plan to invite our 8th grade students to the Cause on May 19.

PASTORAL MINISTRY

We are quickly approaching the 2024 election. I remember the difficulties of the 2016 and 2020 election seasons. Too many families broke apart, and too many friends became enemies. Their differences were not insignificant; each respective side had real justifications and real concerns. Since then, some emotions cooled, some relationships were mended, but others remain apart. Yet, those repaired relationships remain fragile. The political tension is still there, and it will only increase as our election year progresses.

Followers of Jesus have a role to play. Our role, I believe, cuts against the grain of division during this election year. This role will naturally prove difficult. In order to prepare our hearts and minds to play this role, we need to venture into the topic now. We need to give ourselves the runway necessary to do the hard work of being Christlike in an environment that needs us to do so. We need to have meaningful and constructive conversation as we walk along side one another, even in our own differences. We need the uniting power of the Spirit to be among us, to work through us, to be the people God calls us to be.

For the next several Lamplighters, I plan to share with you my learnings and thoughts as I prepare *myself* for the election season. I pray these articles will be beneficial to you as you do the same. A part of my journey is a list of books I plan to read or reread. These books do come from names I trust. I look forward to prayerfully considering the points made in these books, and how I can apply some of them to be the person God invites me to be.

City of God (St. Augustine) – "The City of God is a book of Christian philosophy... The book was in response to allegations that Christianity brought about the decline of Rome and is considered one of Augustine's most important works". I look forward to rereading this book with a 2024 lens. I want to consider how St. Augustine articulated the political relationship between the followers of Jesus and the Roman empire.


Jesus and the Powers (NT Wright & Michael Bird) – "In Jesus and the Powers, N. T. Wright and Michael F. Bird call Christians everywhere to discern the nature of Christian witness in fractured political environments. In an age of ascending autocracies, in a time of fear and fragmentation, amid carnage and crises, Jesus is king, and Jesus's kingdom remains the object of the church's witness and work." These are two names I trust and am eager to hear what they have to say in this newly published writing!

Strange Religion (Nijay Gupta) — "Within Roman society, the earliest Christians stood out for the oddness of their beliefs and practices. They believed unusual things, worshiped God in strange ways, and lived a unique lifestyle. They practiced a whole new way of thinking about and doing religion that would have been seen as bizarre and dangerous when compared to Roman religion and most other religions of the ancient world." Dr. Gupta is a favorite professor of mine, and I am interested in learning how the earliest Christians navigated a world dominated by the Roman empire (and its politics). I think this book will pair well with the City of God and the Exiles book from Preston Sprinkle (below).

Exiles: The Church in the Shadow of Empire (Preston Sprinkle) — "Dr. Preston M. Sprinkle reminds us that the first-century church was not an apolitical gathering, where Christians left their Roman politics at the door. It also wasn't a place where Christians mounted a Roman flag next to—or above—a Christian one. Church was a place where God's plan for governing the world was revealed, where one could witness what it means to follow the Creator's design for human flourishing." By now, our church is well-acquainted with Preston Sprinkle. I am interested in hearing his perspective on how Jesus' followers can navigate the political landscape of our day.
