

# **BIBLE & THEOLOGY**

I recently had a student ask me why God calls Himself "*I AM*," such as in Exodus. I thought this was a great question, so I told her I would do a study and write a Lamplighter article on it.

I AM – In Exodus 3 (the story of Moses and the burning bush), God calls Himself "I AM WHO I AM". In my studies, there seems to be a connection to God's name YHWH, interpreted as LORD in some translations. YHWH is the third person masculine singular form of the verb, and may be translated as "He is" or "He will be". To better grasp what is meant by I AM, it is necessary to survey the rest of God's revealed Word to learn about "who He is" as revealed in Scripture.

In my study, I did find two neatly compiled categories in the Dictionary of the Old Testament Pentateuch that concisely lists characteristics and roles of God (as found in Scripture), especially found in the first five books of the Old Testament, that may prove helpful:

Creator – God is our Creator! God *creates* as an expression of His own plan and purpose. God brought order to His creation, and assigned responsibility to His creation. God gave humans their own respective creative purposes. God is also a Creator with no opposition.

Sovereign - Deuteronomy 10:17 – "God of gods and Lord of lords". God has no rival. God has the right to pronounce commandments, decrees, and statutes. God is the determiner of right and wrong. This is not expressed by mere force, but can even use sinful human choices to accomplish His purpose (e.g. the hardening of Pharaoh's heart).

Father/Parent – God's parental relationship expresses personal intimacy. The relationship between God and His children is dialogical (two-way), not monological (one-way). God is creating a family, one that invites His creation to freely be in relationship with Him.

**Redeemer** – God *restores* those that rebelled back into fellowship with Him. Redemption is always initiated from the personal sovereign Creator. God's redemption overcomes any opposing power in the universe – nothing can inhibit God's redeeming work.

Judge – God is glad to restore sinners back into fellowship with Him, but it should not lead anyone to go forward and sin with impunity. Sin has consequences, and for God not to judge would destroy God's good creative order.

Holy – In short, this is God's "otherness". There are essential differences between the divine and ordinary. God's **Unfailing Love** – This can be described as a favor to someone who does not have a right to that favor, by someone who does not have to give that favor. God's love is unlike any other love -a love that includes self-denying faithfulness. Truth – God is true to His people in unheard of ways. He is *true* to His covenants, *true* to His promises. God is

behavior is *holy*. God also calls those in covenant with Him into "holy character" the fits within His *own* holy character. entirely dependable. God's truthfulness lays down the foundation for the concept of objective truth.

Just – God has consistently right behavior. God's ordinances are always the right way for people to live.

**Purity** – God is wholly *good*, wholly *clean*. Anything not good or unclean is best described as an absence, rather than having self-existent.

So, how shall we comprehend I AM? Perhaps we shall let the name direct our attention to who God is. Let I AM guide our thoughts to His revealed Word, which shares with us these characteristics and roles of God.

# PASTORAL MINISTRY

As noted in last month's article, I am preparing myself for the 2024 election. I desire to have my thoughts and behaviors suitable for the calling God has on my life. As part of my preparations, I plan to read a list of books from trusted authors that I believe will challenge me to be the person I should be.

The first book I read was Exiles: The Church in the Shadow of Empire, written by Preston Sprinkle. Since I've been consuming other content from Preston in the recent months, and since I am well-aware of his easy-to-read writing style, I figured this would be a good book to start with. Below is the book description, followed by my personal takeaways.

Dr. Preston M. Sprinkle reminds us that the first-century church was not an apolitical gathering, where Christians left their Roman politics at the door. It also wasn't a place where Christians mounted a Roman flag next to—or above—a Christian one. Church was a place where God's plan for governing the world was revealed, where one could witness what it means to follow the Creator's design for human flourishing.

### My Takeaways

Christ is King. No matter what the results are on November 6, 2024 (the day after the election) the "breaking news" is that Christ is King. The reality of Christ's Lordship is always the most important news. If Jesus truly has risen and sits at the right hand of God, there is no reason to place my hope (and allegiance) in anyone else. This doesn't mean that the next elected president is inconsequential. What it does mean is that I view the president (and any earthly leaders) through the reality that Jesus is in charge.

Christ's Kingship is political. This proclamation was a direct threat to Rome. Jesus was king, not the emperor. Jesus as King turns the world upside-down. This is true today as it was then. The *hatred* for someone's political enemy is subverted by Christ's love for the enemy. A nation's ambitions for peace through strength is subverted by Christ's modeling of peace through weakness (think about the beatitudes). The commission Jesus places on His followers is essentially incompatible with the self-preservation needs of earthly kingdoms.

Christ's Kingship is best proclaimed through the church, not an earthly nation. Since the nature of Christ's rule is incompatible with the nature of earthly nations, we must function through God-given infrastructure, specifically the Church. No earthly nation aspires to inherent the earth in meekness (again, think about the beatitudes). The body of Christ, however, can and must. The whole reason the institutional church exists is precisely to proclaim Christ's rule. If Jesus wanted to demonstrate His kingship through a militarized, earthly nation, we would have seen Jesus' first coming as one that so many were (wrongly) expecting in the first century. But, that's not what the Holy Scriptures show. Jesus came from the throne room and made Himself a servant. I'm convinced no earthly nation would want their ruler to truly be like Jesus.

Citizens of Heaven serve as Prophetic Witness - God has placed me in America in 2024 for a reason. I'm not called to live completely detached from the society around me, nor am I called to actualize the values of heaven through earthly kingdoms, that were never designed to view the world as the church does. Rather, I'm called to operate through the body of Christ as prophetic witness in my interactions with earthly nations. In other words, in any moment that I plea / take action for a societal change in America, I make that plea / take action as part of the church (Preston would describe the church as an "outpost" of heaven on earth).
