The Board of Trustees meets once a month to discuss and review the monthly financial report of the church and the upkeep of the church building and grounds. Recent repairs and maintenance include replacing the doors in the second floor Sunday school wing and having paving work done in the parking lot to address some standing water areas in the parking lot. A fire inspection was done by the City of Canandaigua and as a result all smoke detectors in the church were changed. Future repairs will include annual replacement of roof shingles, which should occur in August, and some gutter work as well as annual maintenance to the boilers. Other future projects that are currently under discussion are needed repairs to the Narthex including floor and wall repairs.

Because He first loved us we have commissioned Natalie Cunningham, Summer Cunningham, Grace Payne, ad Jennifer Petacchi as summer 2024 Christian camp staff. “Made for This” is the camp theme as they are role models to children each week. Pray for all summer camp staff preparing for a summer of service.

Because we care, our mission budget is providing twenty-eight camperships to our younger people this summer! Because we care we have contributed forty-six school kits for distribution by Church World Service.

Our supported missionaries, : Carlos Bonilla & Mayra Giovantti – the BGs (Central/South America), Tim & Patti Long (Baja Mexico), Shelvis & Nancy Smith-Mather (S Sudan refugees in Uganda), Ryan & Alethia White (Berlin) are each meeting refugees seeking safety. Called to Care Canandaigua is able to welcome a refugees from Haiti and Ukraine.

We worship together and network to care for others in Canandaigua. Collaboration with Canandaigua Churches in Action, Canandaigua Salvation Army, Gleaner Kitchen, and Food Link’s Pop-up pantry help feed people near us.

The United Church partners with and supports Living Waters for the World (LWW) especially for its clean water ministry in the Yucatán Peninsula. I returned recently from a 2nd year “sustainability trip” with the Newark Rotary Team to the community of Tabi, Mexico, where the “Planta Hidekel” water plant is providing safe water at an affordable price for nearly 1,200 residents in two communities. Many United Church members financially supported the construction phase of the plant and prayed for the community as it awaited the plant’s opening. It is now two years running, relationships among all participants have improved, and the water committee is nearing sustainability. Such good news! While in Quintana Roo this year I also visited the community of Limones, the workers at its Planta Itzae which was installed in 2018, and brothers and sisters of the Misión Sinai Presbyterian Church. I also visited the very rural community of Cedralito where a LWW plant was installed in 2011. It is a credit to the passionate work of members of the

Misión Monte Horeb Presbyterian Church, with only seven members, that this water plant has remained sustainable after these many years. As you might imagine however, some upgrades are now needed and thankfully our United Church mission committee is going to consider a short term mission project to partner with Living Waters for the World. Personal reflection...

I really enjoy gardening. At times, when I stop and reflect on what I would like to do when I have more time to spare, I daydream about gardening - for hours and days on end! In fact, there's not just *one* thing I like about it, there are many. I enjoy being outside, digging in the dirt and feeling the earth that God created, seeing my perennials bud with new life, adding a few annuals for color. I sometimes ask Ryan to transplant large plants moving them to a better spot, and I even like weeding. I think my favorite part is working on a part of a garden for a while, and then stepping back and seeing how beautiful it looks when I'm done.

Sometimes God is "personified" as a gardener. He plants seeds, His Spirit waters them through life experiences, and, in the fullness of *His* time, those seeds sprout and grow into a beautiful faith. Oh, if it were just that plain, simple and easy! Anyone who has lived for a while knows it is not that cut and dry. There are times when we are pruned by God. Maybe God is pruning you right now. It can be a painful experience, but how much more fruitful we are after His careful pruning! There are other situations when God completely uproots us and transplants us to a new spot. Wow! This can be especially difficult. We have roots that were established that now have to be re-established. We have to figure out how to flourish in our new place, and it might have very different soil or sunlight or water than we are used to. Ugh! What *now*, we think? Or, *why* now? I was just fine where I was, thank You very much! I don't *want* to move; I would rather stay where I am comfortable. Yet, there are other times when we feel just like I imagine a plant feels in the beginning of spring. We have weathered the winter, and now we are seeing more of the sun. We notice that the air is warm. We start to bud. Everything feels great, and spring fades easily into summer. We then begin really growing and even blooming. God cares for us with water, sun, and rest in the cool of night. We are in a very good spot.

At this point in my life, I feel much like I have been transplanted. The parenting tactics I used just 5 years ago when my kids were 6, 10, and 13 do not work now that they are 11, 15, and 18. I don't know that I like this new spot! I had established some nice roots. I felt as though I was growing and flourishing. This new spot is very different. It feels difficult to establish roots and "get comfortable" when my kids are becoming older and much more independent. It seems like things change more often now. I'm still trying to figure out how to grow here in this new space. But while I would prefer to go back in time, God is showing me how to flourish here. Maybe in a year or two, I will feel more established, but this "transplant" is hard; really hard. Lord, give me eyes to see the beauty in what You are doing.

At the risk of sounding redundant, I continue to be taught to fully trust God. He hasn't left my side through this "transplant." He is always there, He is always loving me, He is always showing me the *best* way. I just need to listen. I also need to let go of old ways and move forward, confident that God has for a plan for me in this new season.

Maybe you can relate? Maybe you were in a really comfortable spot for a while, and now you have been transplanted to a new place that just doesn't feel quite right. Or maybe you are noticing that God is busy pruning you in this season, and that doesn't feel very comfortable. In fact, it may hurt! God's word reminds us that He always loves us, even when it feels like things are tough. While He teaches us in a way that feels difficult, it's out of love. In the end, we will step back and see how beautiful we have become due to His work in our lives.

YOUTH & ADULT MINISTRIES

Youth

At **The Cause**, we have finished our conversation on the topic of human sexuality. Before the end of the year, we are piloting a discernment process with our students, with the aim to equip them with discernment skills to interpret the world through the lens of Jesus. Additionally, we have welcomed our 8th graders to the Cause! On June 2, we are also hosting an “Ask Pastor Wade Anything” night for our students!

For May, our **Special Event** included our first (of two) chicken bbq fundraiser!. We are in the process of ironing out details for our “summer missions experience” during the summer. Our **monthly school district connects** (including Victor, Canandaigua, and Marcus Whitman) will continue until the end of the school year.

For **Youth Sunday School**, both our Middle School and High School groups are using the Deep Discipleship curriculum. At **Youth Club**, our Middle School students continue to use the Hyfi curriculum.

Our **Youth Ministry Team** continues to meet every couple months or so. Moving into the summer months, this team will be supporting our special events, and planning for the new program year.

Young Adult

The **Young Adult lunch** will move to once a month in the summer (third Sunday of the month for June, July, and August), with spontaneous connections sprinkled in between. We have ended our **Saturday evening connect** for Young Adults for the program year. Our **Young Adult Sunday School** connect has finished after being combined with the adult education groups for a class of LBGTQ+ matters. The **Young Adult Women’s small group** (led by Stephanie Wall) continues to meet at our church every other week or so.

The **Young Adult Ministry discernment team** continues to meet periodically. They continue their exploration on how we can best minister to the young adult population. Mark Sheppard has reserved a cabin in the Southern Tier in the fall for a potential young adult event, and Wendy Bacon has signed up to be the staff support for the FLCC Christian club for the Fall semester.

Adult

For our **Adult Education Sunday School Hour**, our adult education has finished our class on LBGTQ+ matters. The corporate prayer session will continue, and will discern what the summer months will look like for them. For the Fall program semester, we will be conducting a Genesis series and bringing back the Parenting Coffee Hour.

For **Special Events**, we are planning to host the **Adult Education Retreat** at Onanda Park, August 17 (Wally Fleming is the speaker). On November 2, we are hosting our first **United Church Seminar**, with our guest lecturer being Dr. Richard Middleton. He will be speaking on the Abraham & Isaac story, the suffering of Job, and the importance of the lament Psalms. This will be a public event.

The **Adult Education Ministry Team** continues to meet periodically to plan for the Fall program semester, our special events, and other ministry matters.

BIBLE & THEOLOGY

I recently shared a short essay with the Official Board on our church's Statement of Belief, specifically regarding our view on Scripture. Below you will find this belief statement and my responsive write-up. This essay is admittedly much too short, but I still aim to provide interesting information and statements to consider.

SCRIPTURE is the unique and authoritative Word of God, in human language

Scripture

The Bible is God's revealed word to His people, in written form. Through centuries of Spirit-led discernment and definition, God's people collected and preserved these canonized writings.

Old Testament

Its' overall formation was first conveyed orally through God's initial revelation to His people. Overtime, these divinely inspired words were written down. These writings were collected over a large period of time (e.g. the collections of the Psalms are estimated to have taken 500 years!). Once they were collected, they were sorted and fixed into a canonized unit, which was determined through a consensus by religious leaders during the course of Israel's history (of course guided by the Holy Spirit). Scholars believe these writings and collections took place during key moments in Israel's history, including during the Sinai experience after the exodus, during the shift from theocracy to monarchy, the fall of Jerusalem and their subsequent exile, and in post exilic Jerusalem (during the time of Ezra and Nehemiah). Centuries after Jesus, the Christian church councils affirmed the collection of divinely inspired and authoritative books.

New Testament

By the first and early second centuries, initial collections of New Testament writings started to emerge, circulate, and be regarded as authoritative for determining faith and practice (however, some books were still disputed). By the end of the second century, the need for an authoritative list increased, as heterodox Christian groups started to produce their own collections of writings. By the third century, the 27 books of the New Testament that we know of today were widely considered as the authoritative writings. Criteria used to select these writings were numerous, with four key filters: *Apostolicity* (writings genuinely attributed to the apostles); *Orthodoxy* (texts that stayed true to the Gospel); *Antiquity* (those written close to the time of Jesus and the apostles); and *Catholicity* (writings widely accepted among the churches).

Authority of Scripture

As NT Wright puts it, "the notion of the 'authority of scripture' is a shorthand expression for God's authority...". God uses the Bible as His means of "equipping and calling the church". This authority enables us to "stand humbly in the councils of God, in order then to stand boldly in the councils of men". We do so "by soaking ourselves in Scripture, in the power and strength and leading of the Spirit, in order that we may then speak freshly and with authority to the world of this same creator God."

This authority does not work as a simple rulebook or a list of doctrines, but rather works as a story of God, a worldview (a 'God-view'), which invites all into full-on participation. This Spirit-filled participation liberates human beings, judges and condemns evil and sin, and sets people free to be fully human.

PASTORAL MINISTRY

This month's article is the second of a series of reflections on my personal preparations for the 2024 election. As part of my preparations, I am reading through a list of books from trusted authors that I believe will challenge me to be the person I should be (the full list can be found in April's Lamplighter).

The second book I read was **Jesus and the Powers**, written by NT Wright & Michael Bird. Most know NT Wright for a reason - he is a prolific author and has made major contributions to New Testament theology and first century understanding. Michael Bird is another well-established New Testament scholar, and has complementary knowledge in the political sphere to aid his theo-political conclusions. There is a lot of overlap between this book and last month's book (written by Preston Sprinkle), but *Jesus and the Powers* moves further into application. This book is filled with well-worded statements (I ended with three pages of typed notes!), so most of what is pasted below are selected snippets.

How the Church Can Help Society:

- Assist government in recognizing it is not the ultimate authority
- Tasks the citizenry to aspire toward civic virtue
 - Done by appealing to longstanding religious precepts that provided freedoms and safeguards
- Advocate that humans are treated with the value they are - as image-bearers of the one creator God
- Promote for rights and freedoms, fairness and equality as found in the decalogue, sermon on the mount, and the good samaritan story
- Provide an end goal of freedom and flourishing

Impactful Statements

- The church must provide spiritual resources and support that will produce people capable of both deep conviction and empathy across deep differences
- We need to find a way, in spite of our differences, to together strive for peace and building each other up
- *Truth Over Tribe* - Better to be disappointed that your political candidate lost, than have your candidate win with absolute power
- Our faith is public. The church has something to say. The church has a seat at the table (not just the state, social media influencers, the education system, or political leaders).
- God desires humans to rule and have dominion - and to do so well. Indwelt with the Spirit ourselves and the victory over evil powers won by Jesus, we are to exercise our image-bearing responsibilities in society
- Being made in the "image of God" and "love your neighbor as yourself" is the basis for human rights
- Loving your neighbor leads to loving your enemy
- Let us make sure our religiosity is where it belongs, not in a political leader or political ideology, but in God who rules a kingdom we are citizens of
- Christian's in power should not seek control of all the power, but to do well in faithful public witness
- We stand against political movements that take Christ's name in vain
- Faith is our defiance. This faith is expressed in love. This faith is more powerful than all power
- We defend our own witness and worship, and the liberties of others
- There are still gods in a godless age, we just translate anything that sounds traditionally religious with something else, such as politics
- We come with a vision of redemptive power, beauty, and joy. We come to bring prophetic warnings, encouragement, prayer, peacefulness, and a godly reputation. Sometimes, we need to be a nuisance.
- Apathetic or indifferent churches are more dangerous than empty churches

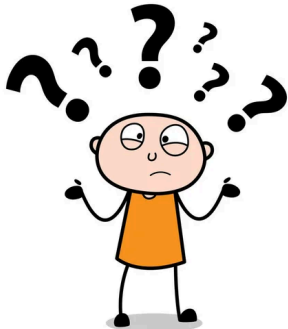
