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Exploring Joseph's Journey as We Begin the Program Year

September is a month of transition at The United Church. As the summer season comes to a close, we face the excitement of the beginning of the program year. We return to two services, Sunday school, and special programs like The Cause and Youth Club, which are preparing to begin. With the cooler air, we enjoy the warmth of extended time together as a church family.

On Labor Day weekend (September 1), we will continue to gather in one service (9:30 AM), but we will transition to two services (8:45 AM and 11 AM) on September 8. Our study in Genesis will also shift to focus on another important character, Joseph. From September 8 to November 10, we will delve into Joseph's story.

Joseph, the favored son of Jacob, was sold into slavery by his jealous brothers and ended up in Egypt, where he rose to power as Pharaoh's right-hand man due to his ability to interpret dreams. Despite his hardships, including false accusations and imprisonment, Joseph remained faithful to God. Eventually, he reconciled with his brothers, who came to Egypt seeking food during a famine, and he saved his family by inviting them to live in Egypt. Through Joseph's trials and triumphs, God's providence was evident, using Joseph's life to preserve the Israelites.

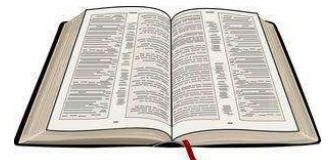

What does it take to be a Christian missionary?

You do need courage to step out in faith. The missionary journey sometimes contains obstacles — like visas, language learning, finances, doubts, loneliness, fear, and more.

Introducing Christine Lafferty, the United Church's newest named commissioned international missionary. Christy has been serving God and her brothers and sisters in Nicaragua since 2012 as a part of AMOS Health and Hope. AMOS uses an empowering approach, **following Christ's example of listening** to and healing the most vulnerable, **engaging** communities as full partners by training local leaders as community health promoters. Their programs provide preventive and curative health services primarily to rural communities with significant barriers to health care.



Christine (Christy) Lafferty is from Cleveland, Ohio. As a young adult, she developed a deep sense of commitment and passion for serving others, motivated by her Christian faith. After studying Sociology and Spanish in college, she followed a call to serve as a young adult missionary for 3 years, working alongside communities in Nicaragua and farmworkers in California. Christy has fallen in love with AMOS's model and community-based approaches. Christy is serving as an endorsed Global Servant (missionary) through International Ministries of Am. Baptist Churches. She also has a special interest in women's health and in her free time has worked with couples as a birth doula and childbirth educator.

Christy facilitates short-term mission opportunities, engages churches as partners in long-term ministry, and helps share the stories of lives being saved and transformed in Nicaragua. Christy is also studying a Master's in Theological Studies (MTS) through Palmer Theological Seminary and will graduate in Aug. 2024. She lives in Managua, with her husband, Abel, and their son, AJ (9).

On October 13 Christy will be with us in Canandaigua. We look forward hearing her missionary journey, the value of short term mission experiences, and an invitation to partner with her in mission.

Patti and Tim Long, missionaries in Tijuana Mexico, have earned retirement status!

We will continue to support The Didaqué School at Monte Horeb Baptist Church of Tijuana. A very special recognition was held at the beginning of the academic year, honoring Patti for her 20 years of teaching ministry with them. The special education program she founded has flourished, and it was so good to gather with the staff of the school, church leaders, and former students. It was especially meaningful to hear from the students themselves as they shared the truly life-changing experiences they had at the school. Two students, currently at university, even brought their now twelve-year-old cherished envelopes full of classwork. The classwork these envelopes held put them on the road to an education that no one, including themselves, thought possible until they started at the Didaqué School.

Personal Reflection

Although my favorite season is coming to an end, there are some things I like about fall. I tend to thrive on routine and structure. Since I have school-aged children, the fall naturally offers a return to routine. The routine of school days helps me to develop and stick to my own daily routine of time with the Lord, exercising, working, driving kids to activities, and family time. Though I love summer for many reasons, it typically does not offer much structure, and I often notice that I lose the balance that the school year routine naturally offers.

Of course, we are all unique and not everyone thrives with a lot of routine and structure; however, I do think there is a basic, fundamental, God-given desire for some routine in each one of us. I believe this because when you look closely at the creation account, you will see that there is a routine of 6 days of work, then 1 day of rest. This most basic routine is part of who we were created to be. When we embrace this most basic routine, I think we become more truly who God wants us to be.

If you've read other monthly reflections of mine, you might remember that I am not good at the "rest" part. But, I am working on it. As summer comes to an end, and I look toward fall, which will be naturally busier for our family, I am contemplating how to fit rest in to my week. However, I think that's the wrong approach. Much like the command to tithe, I think the command to rest works best if we *start* with rest. I need to schedule my day of rest first. I need to block it off and protect it and ensure that my Sabbath day is only filled with restful, life-giving events. This means I need to say "no" to things - even when they seem good. And, I need to only say "yes" to things that will bring restoration and joy. Once I have my Sabbath day picked and protected, then I need to be diligent to schedule things around that day. I also need to fight the urge to make a to do list for my Sabbath day because, for me, that very quickly turns into work.

I am hopeful for this school year ahead that I can enjoy a routine that includes a regular rhythm of rest. I invite you to join me. Maybe you're already great at keeping a Sabbath day and you have some tips for me, I welcome that, too! However, if you're like most people in our culture, I'm guessing you can relate to being busy and trying to fit rest in, which rarely (or never) seems to happen. A once-a-year, week long vacation can't make up for missing 51 days of rest. There's a reason rest is supposed to happen once a week. So, let's join together and schedule a day of rest first, then schedule around it. Guess what? It's ok if your Sabbath day is Sunday one week and Saturday the next week. It's also ok if your Sabbath day is on a weekday - well, as long as you're retired or have the day off. Let's not impose a bunch of rules about our day of rest. Let's schedule a day and stick to it, even if we need to schedule a day week by week due to the nature of our stage of life. My hope is that we will each find joy in discovering what helps us to rest and what rejuvenates us as we keep Sabbath together.

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PASTORAL MINISTRY

During the summer season, I tackled St. Augustine's classic writing titled **The City of God**. I used an audiobook format (to give you an idea on the size of that book, the audio recording is over 40 hours in duration). Against my better judgment, I added an additional book to my reading list that is touted as the "a *modern day* update to the City of God", titled **Biblical Critical Theory**, written by Dr. Christopher Watkins (an almost 700-page book). To no one's surprise, I have *not* completed these books (about halfway through both). Despite my weariness, I am thoroughly enjoying these writings (especially Dr. Watkins book). Here is a description of Dr. Watkin's book:

Informed by the biblical-theological structure of Saint Augustine's magisterial work The City of God (and with extensive diagrams and practical tools), Biblical Critical Theory shows how the patterns of the Bible's storyline can provide incisive, fresh, and nuanced ways of intervening in today's debates on everything from science, the arts, and politics to dignity, multiculturalism, and equality. You'll learn the moves to make and the tools to use in analyzing and engaging with all sorts of cultural artifacts and events in a way that is both biblically faithful and culturally relevant.

My Takeaways (so far)

We must develop a biblical worldview - the "So What" of our Christian beliefs - "[Biblical Critical Theory] does not try to explain and defend the Bible to the culture; it seeks to analyze and critique the culture through the Bible." *I pray we - as Christians - can understand and live out our "so what" this election season.*

We must cultivate and exercise biblically-guided discernment skills - It is through the revealed will of God, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and the discipleship of believers that we can discern - in real-life scenarios - "what is good and evil, truth and falsehood, beauty and ugliness within the created order". *I pray God leads us to make biblically-sound decisions as we navigate a complicated political atmosphere.*

Through a robust biblical worldview, we must be in-tune with the happenings of the world - St. Augustine had working knowledge of the gods, rulers, and philosophers of Rome. With this understanding, he was able to nuance a biblical critique, not only exposing the errors of Rome (the earthly city), but also presenting the solutions expressed within God's kingdom (God's city), as revealed by God in the Word of God. *I pray that we live our lives in a manner that is intimately aware of the world around us, and at the same time familiar enough with the tenants of God's kingdom. The political realm needs us to be in-tune.*

"The earthly city and the city of God are inextricably intertwined" - This intertwining helps guard against two pitfalls: 1) The abandonment of our calling to be in the world (but not of it); and 2) The disregard of our calling to live our lives as a holy priesthood. This intertwining is an important understanding of our reality: "sin and obedience, judgment and grace, the ethic of violence and the ethic of love" are all part of our embodied experience and the cosmic story. *I pray the Lord uses us and guides us on this narrow path, even when the political environment is heated and uncomfortable.*

The Biblical Critical Theory "diagonalizes" the dichotomies of today's world - While the tribes of this world are increasingly polarized and dependent upon their own hate of the opposition, the biblical worldview reveals "a positive and viable third way" that doesn't dilute into mere compromise. God's will as revealed in the Bible effectively satisfies the true needs identified by earthly worldviews, while at the same time resolves the errors produced within those same earthly theories. *I pray we can show our neighbors how God is the only person that meets the world's needs, both in today's world, and in the world to come.*



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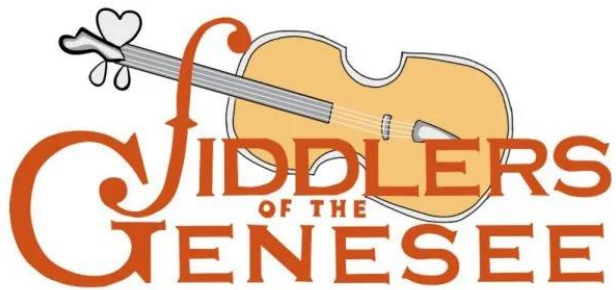
