

As we continue our journey through 1 Peter this summer, we encounter one of Scripture's most compelling paradoxes: we are simultaneously exiles and chosen children of God. This tension isn't something to resolve but rather to embrace as we learn what faithful Christian living looks like in an increasingly secular culture.

Peter understood this dynamic intimately. Writing to believers scattered across the Roman Empire, he addressed people who felt the weight of cultural displacement while holding fast to their identity as God's beloved children. His words speak directly to our contemporary experience as we navigate remaining faithful in a world that often seems indifferent to Christian values.



Rather than retreating in fear or anxiety, Peter calls us to a different wav forward. He reminds us that throughout history, the church has often flourished not in spite of challenging circumstances, but precisely because of them. When the world's systems seem uncertain, God's people have the

opportunity to demonstrate the stability and hope found only in Christ.

Our summer series will explore how this plays out practically. We'll discover how to embrace God's call to holy living while engaging thoughtfully with our surrounding culture. Peter shows us that this isn't about being combative or withdrawn, but about embodying a humble respect that can transform relationships and communities.

As we examine Peter's teaching on remaining faithful in a changing culture, we'll learn that our distinctiveness as Christians isn't meant to isolate us but to position us as salt and light. When we live in ways that are not in line with cultural norms, we are bearing witness to a different way of life, one that proclaims God's Kingdom.

The latter part of our series will address the reality that faith sometimes costs something. Peter doesn't sugarcoat this truth, but he also doesn't leave us to face these challenges alone. Instead, he points us toward the profound peace that comes from casting our cares on the One who cares for us, finding our identity not in cultural acceptance but in God's unchanging love.

We'll conclude by exploring what it means to find peace as exiles. This sort of peace is not an escape from the world around us, but rather a deep resting in God. This peace becomes the foundation for our mission in the world, which we'll celebrate on our final Sunday in August.

As we gather each week at our combined 9:30 AM service, I encourage you to see these summer months as an opportunity to grow deeper in our understanding of what it means to be God's chosen people, equipped and empowered to live faithfully wherever He has placed us.

So I guess the super short answer to 'Why do I serve?' is, because He's given me the ability and heart to do it. Beautifully, in the process of responding to His gift, there are even more blessings! Relationship building, camaraderie, laughter, good conversation, purpose, and joy, to name just a few."

"I've heard it said that a great way to feel better when you're feeling down is to do something for someone else. How has this role impacted your faith or connection to our church family?


By learning about others' faith journeys, I've grown in my own. It has helped me feel more connected to our church family.


Honor for our organist, David Kraft

The Diapson is an international journal devoted to the organ, harpsichord, carillon and church music and has been in circulation for more than 100 years. Each year they select "20 Under 30" which recognizes young people whose career accomplishments place them at the forefront of the organ, church music, harpsichord, carillon and organ building fields, before their 30th birthday. Candidates are evaluated based on how they demonstrate such traits and accomplishments as leadership skills, creativity and innovation, career advancement, technical skills, and community outreach. Also considered are awards and competition prizes, publications and compositions, offices held and significant positions.

Our organist, David Kraft, has been honored in the 2025 Class of "20 under 30." David is pursuing a Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance at Eastman School of Music. He began studying the organ at 13 and has served at several Rochester area churches. David won first prize in the 2021 Albert Schweitzer Organ Competition and was a finalist in the Lynwood Farnam Competition, performing in Montreal. David was featured on *Pipedreams Live!* In 2024 and will perform in the 2025 Piccolo Spoleto L'Organo series in Charleston, South Carolina. An organ technician with Parsons Pipe Organ Builders, David maintains instruments at Eastman and across Western New York.

Fall Program

May Finances

As of the end of May, we are showing \$52.62 in net income. This is \$4,159.48 more than was budgeted for January-May. Expenses for January-May are \$12,721.02 under budget. Donations are \$2,708.58 ahead of budget.

During May, \$6,806.96 of the Boyce Fund for Building and Infrastructure was used for the main floor renovations.
