Do you remember the story of the Trojan horse? The ancient Greeks couldn't conquer Troy by force, so they built a wooden horse, filled it with soldiers, and left it as a "gift." The Trojans, thinking they'd won, brought their enemy's weapon inside their own walls. The city fell. It was not from an outside attack, but from an enemy that destroyed from within.

This October, as we walk through 2 Peter 2, we will discover that the church faces a similar danger. Peter

warns us that false teachers don't announce themselves as enemies. They come disguised as gifts, using biblical language and building relationships. Then they use that trust to bring destruction from within.

What Peter described in the first century sounds familiar today. False teachers still work in secret. They mix error with truth rather than replacing it entirely. They target the vulnerable, looking for those who are struggling or confused.



They treat ministry like a business opportunity. They value immediate gratification rather than godly wisdom. Most troubling, they show no reverence, displaying arrogant confidence instead of humble fear of God.

Like the Trojans, we can be deceived if we're not careful. But Peter's warning gives us hope. If

we know the enemy's strategy, we can defend against it. The good news is that we don't have to fall for spiritual counterfeits.

Here are a few ways we can resist false teachers:

We need to know God's Word. The only way to recognize a counterfeit is to know the real thing. Bank tellers don't study fake money. They handle real bills so much that fakes feel wrong immediately. We need to be familiar with God's Word. When false teaching comes our way, we'll recognize it.

Also, we need to remain connected to mature believers. False teachers often isolate people from healthy community. Stay plugged into community with believers who know God's Word and aren't afraid to speak truth in love. We need each other's wisdom and accountability.

The enemy is still trying to sneak his soldiers inside the church today. But we don't have to be deceived. We have God's Word, the Holy Spirit, and each other. We have everything we need to recognize false teaching.

The Trojans fell because they were deceived. We don't have to fall. We can stand firm in God's truth, protect our church family, and defend the gospel that has been entrusted to us.

TREASURER'S REPORT

During the month of August, we spent \$4,221.65 more than we took in. For the Year to Date, we have taken in \$2,830.35 more than we have spent. Donations are \$416.22 more than budgeted and \$15,172.70 more than 2024. Actual income year to date is \$335,342.85. For comparison, 2024 income at this point in the year was \$316,346.62.

CARE MINISTRY

Fostering Community Within Care Ministry

Care Ministry is made up of many different teams: Stewards, Care Ministers, Transportation, Meal Train, Hospitality, Prayer Shawl, Visitation, Card Ministry and Support. Each one serves in a unique way, yet all share the same heart: to show Christ's love through compassion and care.

In the upcoming year, one of our goals is to foster deeper community between these teams. We know that when we connect with one another, encourage one another, and

pray for one another, our ministry to others grows even stronger. Care happens best when it begins with relationships among those who serve.

You'll see more opportunities in the months ahead for fellowship, training, and gathering together as a Care Ministry family. These times are meant to remind us that we don't serve alone, we are part of something larger, united by Christ and called to extend His love to our church and community.

As part of this vision, we're continuing our "Why I Serve" series. In this issue, members of the Prayer Shawl Teams share what this ministry means to them and the love they knit into every stitch. May their stories encourage each of us to keep offering our own gifts with joy and faithfulness.

Knitting with Purpose: Team Members Speak from the Heart

Within our church family, a quiet but meaningful ministry takes place through the hands of those who knit lap blankets. Each blanket is lovingly created to bring warmth and comfort to someone walking through surgery, illness, or a difficult season. More than stitches and yarn, these blankets carry prayers and the assurance that no one is alone in their journey. In this issue, several of our knitters share what this ministry means to them and the love they hope each blanket conveys.

What inspired you to be part of this ministry of making prayer shawls?



Chris P. (from the Crafty Christians Prayer Shawl Ministry)

What started as a way to make prayer shawls, and not drive after dark, has also become a place to make hats for Gleaners and Golisano NICU, as well as warm afghans - some for our congregation and some for Family Promise and infants. God has provided yarn, a cozy pattern, and the ability to make them. I give all the glory to God, even when people tell me how they stay warm with their afghan.

Rachel R. (from the Prayer Shawl Ministry)

I have always enjoyed knitting, but a family only needs so many sweaters, socks and caps. When I read about the Prayer Shawl Ministry, it seemed like a perfect service project for our church. Just then I discovered two others who were led to the same conclusion. So in 2005 we began knitting and crocheting prayer shawls as a group, meeting together to work once a month. Then a number of retired women took up the challenge by meeting every week. We have received many encouraging responses from those receiving the shawls. I hope we can continue this ministry and we invite others to join with either group. Also, please share a need for a shawl and personally

deliver it. During the past 20 years approximately 150 shawls have been shared.

Doris G. (from the Crafty Christians Prayer Shawl Ministry)

I first became inspired by the ministry of knitting blankets and shawls for others when I was working at another church and they had a group called "Knitting Nellies". I broke my wrist and was laid up for a while and I became a recipient of a loving shawl. I still have that shawl 20 years later and it still is very comforting and I still love those "Knitting Nellies", and I am very happy to be a part of the same ministries.

MISSIONS

On Sunday, October 5, we will be receiving our annual special offering for the World Mission Offering which will be shared equally with the American Baptist World Mission Offering and the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program. This offering provides an opportunity for churches like ours to participate in God's life-changing mission around the globe.



American Baptist Global servants share the gospel in ways that are understandable in their unique places of service. For instance in places like Ukraine, International Mission's Global Consultant Kristy Engel has served internally displaced persons who are suffering the impact of war by helping to create sustainable medical systems. And, International Mission's Mike Mann's ministry uses coffee, a common commodity, to help hill tribe communities in northern Thailand build a sustainable life.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program is the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. There are many circumstances outside our control: wars, natural disasters, disease, accidents, and other people's actions and decisions. Our gifts enable sharing the healing love of Christ through communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic events. By sharing our resources we can respond to the needs around the world, tending to those who are suffering.

MISSION OPPORTUNITIES: As activities are ramping up at church this fall, would you consider helping with our church's mission work? There will be one-time events, ongoing opportunities and of course mission trips! We are also in need of some new ideas and energies on our mission sub-teams! The Collections team takes care of special offerings, the Angel Tree, the 'shopping cart' and any other collections during the year. The Hands-On team works to offer meaningful ways for the congregation to get involved with, well, hands-on activities. Finally, there is the Missionaries Team. This group stays connected to our missionaries and keeps the congregation up-to-date. These teams only meet on an as needed basis so you wouldn't be committing to a lot of meetings! Meanwhile their ongoing work of helping current families facing homelessness continues. Our church is assisting by collecting grocery and gas gift cards to help their guests during the first half of October. North Carolina Hurricane Relief Mission Trip 2026

On Mission Sunday many of you heard the wonderful testimonies of some of the individuals that went on this year's North Carolina mission trip. The work, connections made, and views of destruction were all incredibly moving. While Valley Hope Foundation (the group we worked with) continues their efforts, much more needs to be done. In the first half of 2025 Valley Hope Foundation removed 1.8 million pounds of debris, provided home repairs and demolitions to help families rebuild and distributed over 1.2 million pounds of food. We will be having a second inter-generational trip to North Carolina next year, March 29 -April 3 to contribute to these on-going efforts. There will be an informational meeting on Sunday, Oct.5 following the second service in the Youth room. Please come and learn about the trip and see if this might be an experience you want to try. The walls framed in the parking lot of Zion Fellowship will be used in the construction of the new home going up on Tillotson Street in the near future. Our United Church contributed financially toward the \$10,000 needed for lumber and supplies with a



donation of \$7,000 from the generous gift of the Boyce family. Funds were taken from the "Mission and Spiritual Development Support" allocation area and reflect well one of their intended uses..."local partnerships involving hands-on service." Other partners for the Frenzy included Zion Fellowship, First Congregational Church, Pathway Community Church, First United Methodist Church, St. John's Episcopal Church and the Canandaigua Rotary Club.
