Do you remember waiting for Christmas morning as a child? I had an Advent calendar with a piece of candy on each day, counting down to Christmas. The anticipation was exciting but also agonizing. My parents weren't being cruel by making me wait. They knew Christmas would come at just the right time, and no amount of begging would change it.

This November, as we conclude our journey through 2 Peter and enter the Advent season, we'll discover that our waiting for Jesus' return is similar to waiting for Christmas.

In 2 Peter 3, Peter addresses a question that still challenges us today: If Jesus is really coming back, why is it taking so long? False teachers in the early church were using this delay to mock the Christian faith. They claimed that since Jesus hadn't returned yet, He never would.

Peter's response reveals God's character. The delay isn't because God is slow or has forgotten His promise. From God's perspective the timing is perfect. We are reminded that a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like a day for God. And the delay actually reveals God's patient love for humanity. Every day that Jesus doesn't return is another day for someone to be saved, another opportunity for people to turn to Him.

Another dynamic is how we live until Jesus comes back. Peter urges us to live holy and godly lives, actively working to "speed" Christ's coming through

evangelism, prayer, and obedience. We should invest in what will last forever rather than temporary things. So, while we are waiting, we should make every effort to be found spotless, blameless, and at peace with Him when He returns.

As we conclude our study in 2 Peter, this topic serves as a wonderful bridge to Advent. On the last Sunday of November, we step into Advent, exploring Psalm 122. The ancient pilgrims singing their way to Jerusalem capture what it means to wait with anticipation. They rejoiced at

the invitation to worship. They longed for God's presence. They prayed for peace and committed to work for the good of God's people.

Like those pilgrims, we're on a journey toward home. Our feet may be standing in today's circumstances, but our hearts long for God's Kingdom. We're not killing time until Jesus returns. We're actively preparing, praying, and living for His Kingdom. We're anticipating the day when our waiting will be over and we'll stand in the gates of God's eternal city.

The question isn't when Jesus is coming back. The question is: How are we living because He is coming back? This November, let's live as people who truly believe the promise, who work actively for His Kingdom, and who long with joyful anticipation for our King to come.

Come, Lord Jesus, come.



Do You Have a Background in Care?

In our Care Ministry, we often walk alongside members who are facing difficult seasons—whether due to aging, health concerns, or personal challenges. At times, people need more than a listening ear; they need help with the next step.

That next step might be:

- Guidance on getting into assisted living or a skilled nursing facility.
- Support with finding physical, occupational, or speech therapy.
- A connection to counseling or mental health resources.
- Help navigating practical or emotional care decisions.



As the Director of Care Ministry, I want to make sure we are prepared to connect those within our Church family with the right resources when they need them most. To do this, I am building a confidential Care Referral Contact List of individuals in our church family who have backgrounds in these areas. This could include:



- Retired or current healthcare professionals (nurses, therapists, doctors, social workers).
- Those with experience in senior care, assisted living, or caregiving.
- Anyone with specialized knowledge in counseling, emotional support, or navigating community resources.

If you have experience in any of these areas and would be willing to be listed as a resource for me to contact when questions arise, I would love to hear from you. *You would not be asked to take on responsibilities yourself* but simply to offer guidance, referrals, or suggestions when needs come up.

Please prayerfully consider whether you might share your background in this way. Together, we can make sure no one in our church family feels lost or alone when facing difficult care decisions. "In my former church, I served as a Deacon and as an active member of the Social Action Committee, where I worked to help victims of domestic violence. Soon after joining the United Church, I became very involved with Canandaigua's Care Net and realized that I wouldn't have as much time to devote to church ministry as I had in the past. But I wanted to become involved somehow, and the Transportation Team offered that opportunity. So I gratefully joined. I particularly enjoy transporting members of our church family to and from Sunday service. There's great value in discussing the day's sermon on the trip home, a reinforcement of God's message to us. He's riding with us in the car, helping us to share our faith. I believe the Transportation Team is an important part of our care ministry. Whether someone needs transportation to a medical appointment, to church, or even to visit a hospitalized family member, this team meets that need and shows that the United Church eagerly steps up to support its members."

Sunday School - Our Middle School and High School classes continue, and have successfully experimented with the 10-minute activity time at the beginning of class, led by Lauren S. We will continue this structure to help increase "Sunday-morning energy" and cross-grade relationships. The biggest challenge currently is starting on time, as various students arrive late on different Sundays.

High School Youth Group (The Cause) - Our program year is going along strong! We are currently working through the opening passages of Romans, and tying that in with our larger theme - the fruits of the Spirit - and the Kingship of Jesus (which is further tied into how our story fits into God's story). We are using the SOAP Bible Study method - which provides a conversation-heavy structure to our Scripture readings.

Youth Club Middle School Group Bible Study - Youth Club is also going strong! Due to the large size of this Middle School class, we have had to break out our Bible study time into two separate groups that rotate between a Bible-study activity and the teaching. Additionally, this particular group of students are high-energy, so we are regularly brainstorming among the volunteers and staff to ensure we provide an environment that helps both our students and ministry succeed. Our Bible Study volunteers include Lauren S, Jen C, and Ed B.

School District Connects - Our mid-week connects are underway! Our Canandaigua, Victor, Marcus Whitman, and homeschooling connects are a fun time of fellowship and food! Parents are invited, too! These connects provide an important opportunity for our youth to cultivate faith-based relationships that carry over into the school hallways, classrooms, and events.

Sunday Morning Small Groups - Our Young Adult and Adult ministries are in the middle of our 6-week small group Bible study initiative, following the 2 Peter sermon series. As planned, we have a parenting group, a choir group, young adult group, and two "United" (general) groups. We have learned and adapted as we've journeyed along together with this type of Sunday school approach. We have received positive feedback from both facilitators and participants. Many have felt that following the sermon series has helped them focus on the sermon during service. Others have noted that the small group time has increased conversation and depth during the Sunday school hour. Still others appreciate the smaller groups, making them feel more comfortable and connected. A particular joy has been the young adult group, which reads the Scripture of the day, discusses the passage while walking into town for coffee and back, and ends with prayer. We are grateful for how the initiative

has gone so far, and we are especially thankful for the supportive, adaptable, and invested facilitators we have. By mid-November, we will be transitioning back to a classic Sunday school format; come November 9 to the Sunday school hour

to learn about those offerings!


