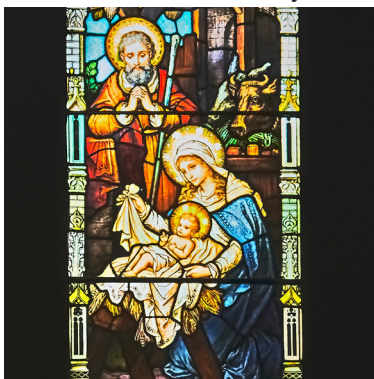

FROM THE PASTOR

The Songs of Longing



Advent is a season of anticipation. We light candles, count down the days, and prepare our hearts to celebrate Jesus' birth. But Advent is about more than remembering what happened in Bethlehem two thousand years ago. It's about learning to live with holy longing, anticipating the day when Jesus will return to make all things right.

This December, we return to the Psalms to guide us through Advent. Some of you may remember our journey through the Psalms during the Easter season, where we followed the lectionary psalm each week from Resurrection Sunday through Pentecost. We explored psalms of praise, lament, and thanksgiving. We discovered how these ancient songs give voice to every human emotion and experience. Now, as we approach Christmas, we turn once again to the Psalms. This time we'll learn how God's people have always lived with longing for God's kingdom to come.

The Psalms are uniquely suited for Advent because they teach us how to wait. They show us how to hold both celebration and yearning at the same time. The psalmists praise God for what He

has already done while crying out for what He has yet to accomplish. They remember God's faithfulness in the past while anticipating His future intervention. This is exactly what Advent calls us to do: celebrate Jesus' first coming while longing for His return.

We'll explore Psalm 72, where Solomon prays for the perfect King. Even at the height of Israel's earthly kingdom, Solomon knew something better was coming. He envisioned a King who would defend the afflicted, provide for the needy, and establish righteousness forever. His kingdom would endure as long as the sun and moon. Solomon's prayer reaches across centuries to Jesus, the King we still anticipate seeing fully revealed.

We'll also turn to Psalm 146, which declares that true hope comes from the God who executes justice, gives food to the hungry, and lifts up those who are bowed down. This psalm reminds us that our longing for justice and peace isn't wishful thinking. It's rooted in God's character and promises. We anticipate God making all things right because we've already seen glimpses of His kingdom breaking into our broken world.

These Advent psalms don't promise easy answers or quick fixes. Instead, they invite us into a posture of faithful waiting. Learning to live in the midst of trusting God while longing for God to work and move is a practice we all need to learn. Our dissatisfaction with the world as it is reveals that we were made for the world as it will be. Our hunger for justice shows we're created in the image of a just God.

This Advent, let the Psalms shape your waiting. Let them give voice to your deepest longings. Let them draw you into anticipation of the day when Jesus will return and every promise will be fulfilled. We celebrate what Jesus accomplished at His first coming while actively anticipating the completion of His work at His return.

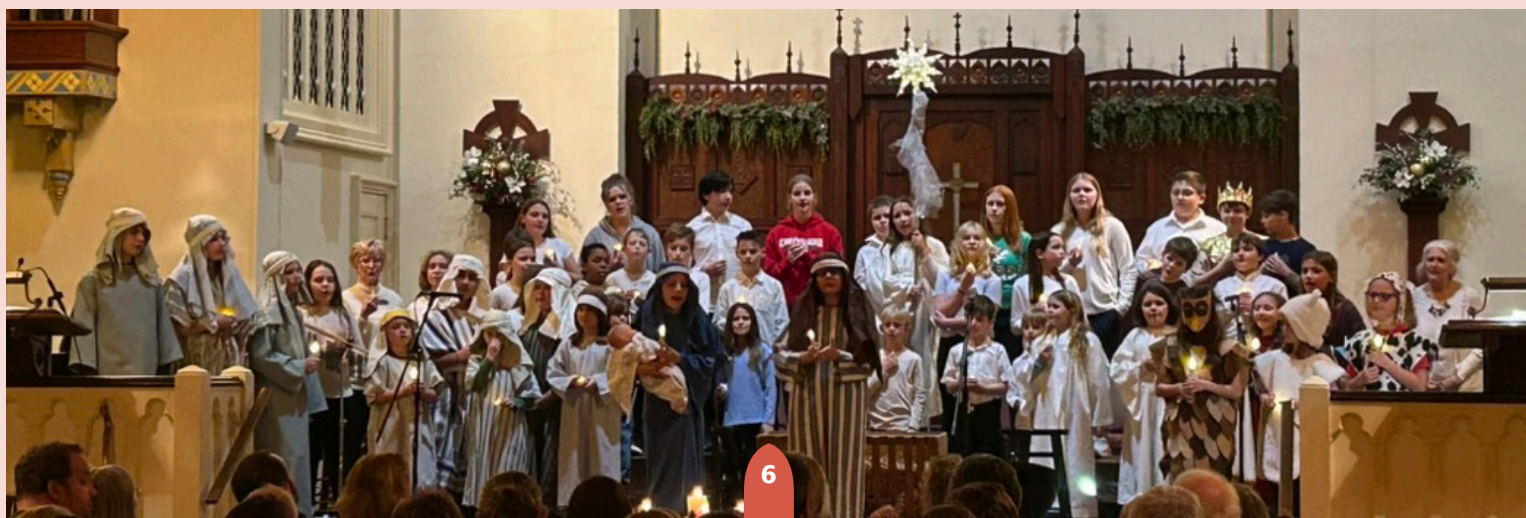

Christmas Pageant

Sunday school kids are preparing for our **Christmas Pageant**. We have been singing songs together for many weeks now. Children aged 3 years old through 12th grade who would like to be a part of this year's pageant, we will have **one mandatory practice on Saturday, December 13th from**

9:30-11:30am in the sanctuary. The Christmas Pageant will take place **Sunday, December 14th during the Sunday school hour (at 10:00)** in the sanctuary. On December 14th, **children in the pageant need to arrive at 9:30 to get into costumes**. The pageant will be followed by a birthday party for Jesus in the fellowship room.



Advent

The season of **Advent** is the 4 weeks prior to Christmas when we prepare our hearts for the coming Messiah. Children and youth will receive Advent devotionals in Sunday School. Let us know if you need one!

- For preschool: **“Silent Night, Holy Night”** allows kids to build a display and add stickers for each day of Advent. Each day, kids read scripture, read a short poem about part of the Christmas story, and place a sticker on their display.
- For Kindergarten through 5th grade: **“Look Around the Stable”** These daily devotions include short story, question, and a prayer for families to read together. This devotional also includes a chain that allows children to add to each day.
- For Middle School: **“Heads up, the Lord is Near”** These daily devotionals for students include scripture, questions, or actions, depending on the day.
- For High School: Pastor Mark has selected Advent devotionals for high school students.

This year Advent begins on November 30th. It is our hope that families will set aside a special time each day to come together and share in the anticipation of Jesus’ birth. **“O Come, Let Us Adore Him!”**

Update on the AMOS Mission Trip

Oct 16-25, 2025

The American Baptist Federation sponsored a mission trip to **El Chile, Nicaragua**, which included our friends from the Elmira Baptist Church, NY, and Texas. A lot of planning went into the trip, as it included hands-on help from the local people. Nicaragua (AMOS) is one of the many missions that our church supports. **AMOS Health and Hope serves 25 communities** providing medical services and clean water for these remote communities. We also support **Christy Lafferty**, an international missionary, whom you may have met during her visit to our church last year. We have sent members in support of AMOS in Nicaragua since 2015. This year's mission team consisted of 4 sub-teams:

1. The **electrical team** provided electrical layouts and installation for the clinic
2. The **water team** provided water training to the local people and installation at El Chile.
3. The **carpenter team** constructed shelves, built benches, and painted.
4. The **medical team** (Eddie, a retired EMT and fireman) spent 2 days training local people in first aid basics.

This full schedule brought much needed resources to El Chile. We can feel pleased that the United Church supports the providing very basics of healthy living that we take for granted to our brothers and sisters through AMOS.

Financial Check-in

Donations received through the end of October are \$5,700 more than last year but \$19,400 less than budgeted. Total income is \$15,200 more than 2024. Total expenses to date are \$21,400 less than budgeted. Our budget for this year predicted that we would need to take \$26,900 from savings by the end of October. We have only needed \$14,000 so far and expect to be able to replace some of this before the end of the year. The Boyce Memorial Fund has received \$21,000 in interest so far this year. This interest has been added to the Ministry and Program Support Reserves portion of the Boyce Memorial Fund.
