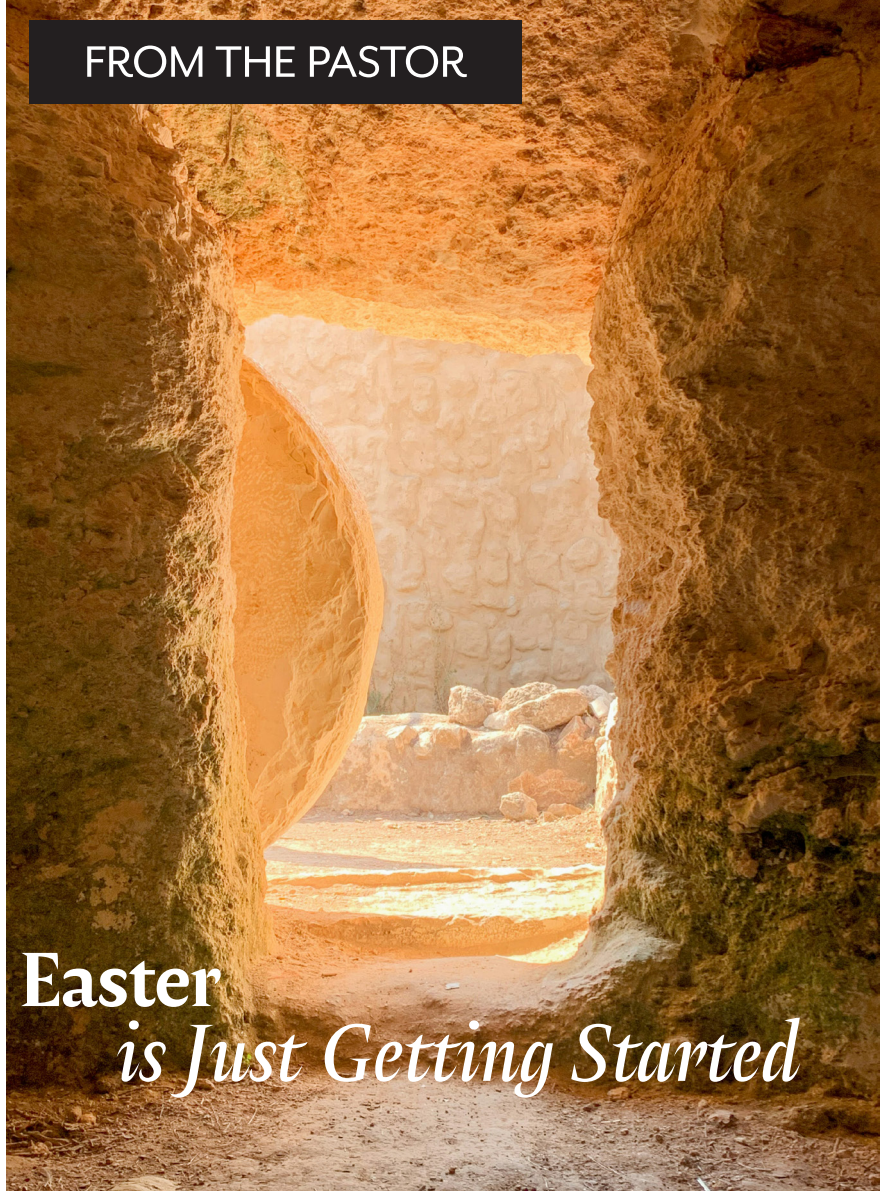

FROM THE PASTOR



Easter *is Just Getting Started*

Most of us grew up thinking of Easter as a single Sunday. We dress up, we sing the hymns, we hear about the empty tomb, and then we move on. Yet Christians have long understood Easter, not as one day, but as a season.

The Easter season stretches from Resurrection Sunday to Pentecost, seven weeks of living in the reality of the risen Jesus. Fifty days. It is important that we don't rush past the resurrection. We need to linger in it, allow it to soak in. And this is what we will do this year.

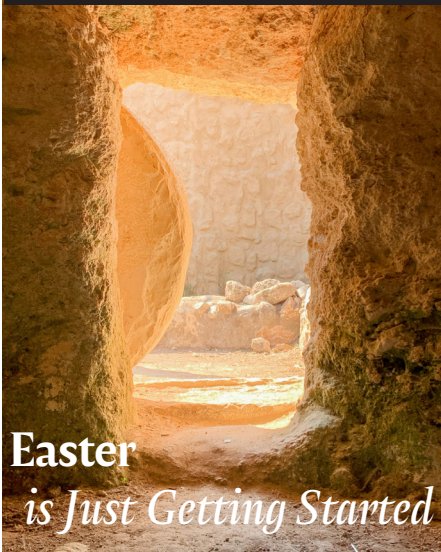

Throughout the Easter season, we will remain in the Gospel of John. We began this series at Christmas. Do you remember? John opened his gospel with the words In the beginning was the Word. We continued to follow Jesus all the way to the Cross, and experience his words and works along the way. Now, on the other side of the empty tomb, John has more to reveal.

Jesus' voice. The following Sunday, April 12, we will gather with the disciples in a locked room. There we find Thomas in his doubt, and we will hear Jesus invite him to believe. These are not just stories we recount once a year. They are the foundation on which everything else is built.

On April 19, we will venture to the shores of the Sea of Galilee. There the disciples are fishing and a familiar voice calls from the beach. A charcoal fire. Breakfast. And for Peter, a restoration. On April 26, Good Shepherd Sunday, we hear Jesus declare that he knows his sheep by name and lays down his life for them. The season will continue through May, leading us all the way to Pentecost Sunday on May 24, when the risen Christ breathes on his disciples and the mission of the church begins.

Here is an invitation for you. Let me encourage you to read along with us. Before each Sunday, spend a few minutes in the passage we will be exploring. Let's allow John's Gospel to help us understand what life in Jesus looks like. The resurrection is not a story we visit once a year. It is the air we breathe as the people of God.

A Network That Encourages and Equips:

Our Connection with The Fellowship Community

One of the meaningful connections that has enriched our ministry here at The United Church is our relationship with The Fellowship Community (TFC). I wanted to take a moment in this newsletter to introduce or re-introduce you to this wonderful network, and share some exciting news about what's coming up.

The Fellowship Community is a national network of Presbyterian Church (USA) churches and leaders committed to living and proclaiming the good news of Jesus. Their mission is simple: gathering, equipping, and encouraging one another for healthy, missional, Christ-centered ministry. For us, this connection has been a wonderful way to deepen and enhance our Presbyterian roots, linking us with other PC(USA) pastors and congregations who share a common heart for the gospel and a commitment to faithful ministry.

What does TFC actually do? Quite a bit, it turns out. They host regional gatherings and monthly Zoom meetings where leaders can connect, learn, and pray together. They maintain a "Find a Call" network to help churches and ministry leaders find one another. They cultivate mission partnerships, including a current partnership with the Ukrainian Evangelical Theological Seminary, whose president Dr. Rusyn recently visited TFC congregations across the country to share how the church in Ukraine is faithfully being "salt and light" even amid the devastation of war. TFC is also currently engaged in a vision trip to Lahore, Pakistan, partnering with Friends of Forman College to see firsthand how the gospel is transforming young lives through education.

This spring, Christy and I will be attending the 2026 TFC National Gathering, April 27-30 in Zionsville, Indiana (near Indianapolis). The theme draws from Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you." The gathering will feature speakers including Kara Powell, Scott Sunquist, Drew Hyun, and Mark Labberton, with workshops focused on younger and future leaders, family ministry, culture, and missional discipleship. We are genuinely looking forward to this time of renewal and connection with fellow Presbyterian leaders from across the country.

We'll look forward to sharing what we learn when we return. In the meantime, if you'd like to know more about The Fellowship Community, you can visit

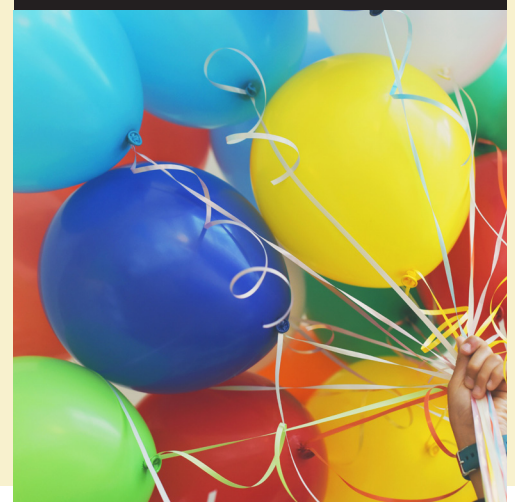


Celebrating Betty Aquadro Owens

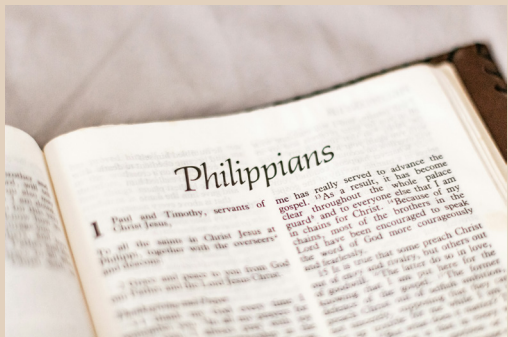
Mid-Week Connects

Transportation Team: As Care Ministry Grows, So Does the Need

As Care Ministry continues to grow at The United Church, so do the opportunities to care in practical ways.

One of the simplest and most meaningful ministries is our **Transportation Team**. For some in our church family, getting to a doctor's appointment or even to Sunday worship is not always easy. A temporary illness, surgery recovery, or no longer driving can quickly become isolating. We are looking to **add more volunteers** so rides can be shared among a wider group. When a need arises, a message is sent out. If it works for your schedule, you respond. If not, that's completely okay. *Volunteers need a valid driver's license and proof of current registration and insurance.* We are also hoping to form a small "urgent" call list for those willing to help with last-minute needs (less than two days' notice).



If you feel even a small nudge, we'd love to talk with you. Please reach out to Margie W., our Transportation Team Coordinator. **Sometimes care looks like prayer. Sometimes it looks like a ride.**

Doing What Is Good

"He has told you, mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" -- Micah 6:8 (NRSVue)

This verse from Micah offers a clear and simple picture of the life God calls us to live, to love kindness and to walk humbly with Him. Recently, while reading Redeeming Eden by Ingrid Faro, I came across a reflection that made me pause. She writes:

"Like Shiphrah and Puah, we may be midwife-ing a new thing, which requires a deep faith and fear of God. Like Jochebed, we may be giving birth and nurturing life in ways that are countercultural. Like Miriam, we may speak words or lead in ways that help carry out God's plan. Or, like Pharaoh's daughter, we may be called to cross social and ethnic boundaries or commit to loving and raising up the next generation of leaders."

What struck me about these examples is that none of these women likely realized the significance of their actions in the moment. They were simply responding with courage, compassion, and faithfulness.

God's work often unfolds that way, through ordinary people who quietly choose what is good. Sometimes that choice looks like offering encouragement to someone who is discouraged. Sometimes it is sitting beside someone who is hurting, offering help when it is needed, or stepping across boundaries to care for someone different from ourselves. These moments may seem small, yet they are often the very places where God's kindness becomes visible.

Perhaps this is one way we continue living out Micah's words, loving kindness and walking humbly with our God.
